Minutes of the Annual General Meeting 2012

Held at: 1.15pm Thursday 29th November 2012, Fowden Conference Hall, Rothamsted Research, Harpenden.

1. Apologies

No apologies were received

2. Minutes of 2011 AGM

3. Matters arising, not covered on the agenda

None.

4. President's report

John Hinde reported on the region's activities for the year; besides the meeting today celebrating 40 years of GLMs, we had successful meetings on:

- 24th September on 'Integrated Population Modelling' joint with the Royal Statistical Society's Environmental Statistics Section, held at Charles Darwin House, London;
- 20th June, 'Statistics in Sport', held in association with the Centre for Sports Studies, University of Kent at Medway Park, and
- 29th March, 'Model selection for genetic and epidemiological data', held with the LSHTM centre for statistical methodology at the LSHTM.

In addition, the 26th IBC was successfully held in Kobe, Japan, 26th–31st August.

At the IBC in Kobe a slightly revised new governance structure for the international society had been adopted. This is detailed at the IBS website, under 'Governance'

James Carpenter has been elected to the newly constituted IBS executive board, to serve 4 years from Jan 2013.

John has been elected incoming president, to serve as president 2014–2016.

John looked forward to the Channel Network Conference in July 2013 in St Andrews; this was to include the Fisher Memorial Lecture by David Spiegelhalter and a plenary lecture by Geert Verbeke.

5. Secretary's Report:

The regional prize for career young biometricians (joint with FMT) would be awarded in Spring 2013. Details of the nomination procedure would be published on the regional website, and in the regional newsletter, in December.

James spoke of the need for members to encourage colleagues to join the region, stressing the benefits of (a) relevant stimulating meetings; (b) members only have access to slides from meetings; (c) electronic access to journals; (d) bursaries for career young members to attend IBCs and (d) good value for money compared with other societies.

6. Treasurer's Report

The audited accounts, attached to the end of these minutes, were accepted.

Mark Brewer and the auditor, Suzanne Clarke, were thanked for their work.

7. Membership Secretary's Report

Diana Cole presented details of the current membership (attached). The welcome rise in the number of full members was noted. The large number of student members was also welcomed.

Diana was thanked for her work.

8. Election of Officers, Committee and International Society

John thanked the out-going members of the committee: Sara Geneletti and Richard Emsley.

The following were elected:

- Officers, to serve 1 year renewable terms:

- 9. Election of Auditor: Suzanne Clarke (Rothamsted)

Geoff Freeman asked about plans for meetings in 2013; John outlined the programme, in particular drawing attention to the planned meeting marking 41 years of the Cox model, at the LSHTM.
